Health News

North Bergen School District Guidelines for Sending Ill Students Home from School

Information for Parents

"My mom told me to come to school and if I'm sick you can send me home."
"I threw up last night or had a fever but my mom had to go to work." "I've missed too many days but



if the nurse sends me home it will be excused." School nurses hear these things all the time. The school Nurse will assess what we see, hear, sometimes smell and measure. We will support your decision to send your child to school by sending students back to class unless they are too sick to stay in school or are contagious. The school Nurse office cannot be used to avoid an absence. If your child is ill please keep them at home.

A parent or guardian or designated contact on file at the school will be contacted to pick up a child within a reasonable time frame for the following conditions:

- Signs or symptoms of a communicable disease
- Oral temperature of 100 degrees or greater
- Signs or symptoms of acute disease or serious accident/injury
- Vomiting (not related to a single event such as gagging, positioning, mucous, running, eating or car/bus ride sickness
- Diarrhea of 2 or more loose watery stools
- Asthma symptoms that do not respond to prescribed medications
- Diabetes blood sugar greater than 400, positive ketones, inadequate supplies to treat diabetes at school
- Uncontrolled coughing with illness

- Severe pink eye with purulent drainage
- Live head lice not under treatment. Student should return to school as soon as possible after first treatment



According to the assessment of the Nurse, if staying in the classroom is counterproductive to the student's education, or the safety and wellness of self and others, a decision may be made to send the student home. Please make sure the office has the correct telephone numbers at all times. This is very

important for the safety of your child. In the event of a real emergency school personnel may call 911 and the student may be transported to a medical facility via ambulance.

There may sometimes be reasons to stay in school:

- A cold, especially in high school, is not a good reason to miss class. *
- Menstrual cramps may occur monthly so please plan for pain management and have your child come to school prepared with pads for the occurrence.
- Students are not sent home because they are tired.
- Sore throats that have no other symptoms (ex. Fever, vomiting, strep odor)
- Stomachaches without other symptoms (ex. Fever, vomiting, persistent diarrhea)
- Chapped lips should be taken care of at home. Parents are encouraged to give their children lip ointment as needed. Students are not to leave class for this unless there is severe bleeding
- Splinters will only be removed if they are received at school and are accessible and visible. Otherwise they will be covered and a note sent home
- Headaches without other symptoms
- Eye glass repairs should be done at the eye glass store
- Ear aches unless associated with other symptoms (ex. Drainage, fever)
- Nurses will not pull out baby teeth and you will not be called if the tooth comes out
- Nurses will not treat piercings

Physical Education Excuses:

Students requesting to be excused from gym class must bring a note from their doctor signed by their parent to the Nurse. The gym and classroom teacher will be made aware. A note will be required with notice when the student will resume gym.

Students Who Need The Elevator:

A doctor note will be required with a time frame to use the elevator. Students are not permitted to use the elevator without an adult present.

Any additional guidelines necessary for special needs students will be addressed in their IEP and their Health Care Plans.

It is our goal to provide a safe, healthy learning environment for all our students. Thank you for your support.
